Journeying to the Cross with Christ

Il of us have been on a trip or a journey at one time or another. We got ready, packed our bags, got the kids ready, and went. Our journeys were cross-country trips or simple trips to the store. Some of us enjoy the journey whether it be a long or short one and others of us try to see how fast we can reach our destination or get our errands done.

My wife calls me "Road Trip Fritz" because I try to beat a new personal best every time we travel long distances. She knows all too well that I don't like to make many stops along the way. But there are always detours and unexpected stops along the journey that can be life changing moments in disguise. These detours may lead us to interactions with people, places, and events that can change our lives.

The journey to the cross with Jesus is filled with many of these moments and interactions. People come to Jesus looking for healing and wholeness. Annual Meeting Highlights

Pastor Scott Fritz led opening devotions. He directed attention to Trinity's Mission Statement: To reflect God's love and grace by welcoming everyone, sharing our gifts, caring for those in need, and witnessing to Christ as our Savior. He then referred to his Pastor's Report in the **Trinity Evangelical Lutheran Church Annual Report 2015** (Annual Report 2015). He often hears concerns about the need to grow the church. He proposed that what's needed is for each of us to grow: we are to be Christ's witnesses, to be welcoming, to be loving; we are to be Jesus in the world.

To assist people in understanding the many numbers in the financial portion of the Annual Report 2015, Secretary Marilyn Bohl directed attention to the first page of the financial reports within the Annual Report 2015. Total Member Giving for 2015 was \$47,275.27, which is almost \$2,000 below projections and \$4,000 below the Total Member Giving for 2014. Miscellaneous Income from AA groups, other churches, SCIC, and the like using our facilities was \$43,343.74. Real Estate-monthly rentals from our rental properties-was an even bigger number: \$102,657.40. The Total Budget Receipts from all sources was \$194,827.85.

Referring to the budget expense that followed, Ms. Bohl directed attention to the expense year-to-date (YTD) total of \$195,981.22. She concluded that 2015 actual expenses were about \$1100 higher than the 2015 budget receipts actually received. She further pointed out that the \$195,981.22 is significantly less than the congregation-approved 2015 expense budget of \$213,158.90, primarily because we had budgeted for a full-time pastor to arrive April 1, and Pastor Scott arrived July 17. She mentioned that the Finance Committee worked hard to trim items in the 2016 expense budget before it was presented to the congregation for approval, but cautioned that with a full-time pastor all year the congregationapproved 2016 expense budget exceeds \$214,000.

Additional financial details and discussion of the Annual Report 2015 followed. After all questions posed by attendees had been addressed, President Rice asked for a motion to accept the Annual Report 2015. Motion was made, seconded, and passed unanimously.

Jim Young, Kathy Glendening, and Roland Johnson were elected unanimously to serve one-year terms on the 2016 Nominating Committee.

Joy Fritz was elected unanimously to fill the open three-year term on the Audit Committee. She joins current Audit Committee members Arline Walter and Cristine Santos in this capacity.

Announcements, many of which are presented elsewhere in this newsletter, followed.

A copy of the Annual Report 2015 has been prepared for each family unit of the congregation. If you have not received the report, but would like a copy, please contact the church office.

The following is an excerpt from Martin Luther's Large Catechism on the Second Article of the Apostles' Creed, "And [I believe] in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord…"

If anyone asks, "What do you believe in the second article about Jesus Christ?" answer as briefly as possible, "I believe that Jesus Christ, true Son of God, has become my Lord." What is it "to become a lord"? It means that he has redeemed and released me from sin, from the devil, from death, and from all misfortune. Before this I had no lord or king, but was captive under the power of the devil. I was condemned to death and entangled in sin and blindness.

For when we were created by God the Father and had received from him all kinds of good things, the devil came and led us into disobedience, sin, death, and all misfortune. As a result, we lay under God's wrath and displeasure, sentenced to eternal damnation, as we had merited it and deserved it. There was no counsel, no help, no comfort for us until this only and eternal Son of God, in his unfathomable goodness, had mercy on us because of our misery and distress and came from heaven to help us... He has snatched us, poor lost creatures, form the jaws of hell, won us, made us free, and restored us to the Father's favor and grace...

Let this be the summary of this article, that the little word "Lord" simply means the same as Redeemer, that is, he who has brought us back from the devil to God, from death to life, from sin to righteousness, and keeps us there. The remaining parts of this article simply serve to clarify and express how and by what means this redemption was accomplished that is, how much it cost Christ and what he paid and risked in order to win us and bring us under his dominion. That is to say, he became a human creature, conceived and born without sin, of the Holy Spirit and the Virgin, so that he might become Lord over sin, moreover, he suffered, died, and was buried so that he might make satisfaction for me and pay what I owed, not with silver and gold but



with his own precious blood. And he did all this so that he might become my Lord. For he did none of these things for himself, nor had he any need of them. Afterward he rose again from the dead, swallowed up and devoured death, and finally ascended into heaven and assumed dominion at the right hand of the Father. The devil and all his powers must be subject to him and lie beneath his feet until finally, at the Last Day, he will completely divide and separate us from the wicked world, the devil, death, sin, etc. Ω



- In opening devotions, Pastor Scott Fritz (Pastor Scott) read 1 Peter 2:9. He invited Council members to move from what is comfortable/ordinary/proper. He warned against having such a strong desire to control that one ends up creating a selfconstructed fortress that shuts others out.
- 2. Pastor Scott is pleased to see people stepping up to carry out the hospitality measures advocated in the hospitality training session in November. Many members welcomed the mother and three small children two weeks ago. Joy Fritz was out front greeting people last Sunday. The Synod may offer bookkeeping services to congregations at a fee of \$500.00 per month. Pastor Scott will be on vacation at year-end. The conference dean, Pastor Proper of Our Savior's Lutheran, is back from Sabbatical. Pastor Scott will also leave the phone number of his good friend Pastor Ioan Ittuh who will preach the first Sunday in January and will be available other times if needed.
- 3. The deadline for grant proposals to the Synod is January 22, 2015. President Rice observed that about 160 proposals were submitted last year, and about 70 requesting organizations got at least some amount in response to their proposals. Pastor Scott offered to come up with a couple of proposals for grant requests by next Council meeting.
- 4. President Larry Rice expressed sincere thanks on behalf of himself and of the

Council to Kistyn Gritney, who served 6 years on Council, and to Kirk Olsen, who is completing a one-year term, for their work on Council and on other committees at Trinity. President Rice welcomed Trevor Wolter and Marilyn Bohl as newly elected members of the 2016 Council. He noted that one 1-year position remains to be filled. The Nominating Committee has been asked to provide candidates for the 2016 Nominating Committee at the January 24, 2016, Annual Congregation Meeting, Part 2.

- There has been no response to the child care position posting on Trinity's website. Pastor Scott and Trevor Wolter noted one response had come in that day, but affirmed that the information about the position will be circulated more widely.
- 6. Trevor Wolter and Kirk Olsen proposed that the Visibility Subcommittee be folded into the Outreaching Committee. Cooper Hundertmark and Trevor Wolter recognize help is needed on the Outreaching Committee, so they will serve. Jim Young noted that he "will be available to fold" if needed.
- 7. Bob Pedder has brought to the Property Committee a concern about termites on the north side and back of the sanctuary. He agreed to have the termites taken care of at a cost of \$450.00. The front area of the sanctuary has been treated for termites a couple of times, but the back area has not. The Property Committee authorized the expenditure for the project.


- 8. Business Manager Hermine Burg reported that the 5 certificates of deposit (CDs) that matured in the September – December 2015 time frame have been reinvested by the financial officers in accord with the Council authorizing motions passed earlier. The two Endowment Fund "old money" CDs were combined into one CD. \$20,000 was added to the savings account CD, yielding a total of \$100,086.21 in that CD. The total of all CDs is \$236,757.35. All were invested at Farmers & Merchants Bank, at a rate of 1.45% (far better than available elsewhere) for a time of 5 years, but the principal can be extracted any time after two years with no loss of principal and a 6-month loss of accumulated interest.
- 9. The "Procedure for Approval of Payment of Bill and Invoices" was approved. Secretary Marilyn Bohl proposed that this procedure and the procedure for collection of rents be established as Continuing Resolutions so that they are not lost but instead become part of the official governing documents of Trinity: CR 17 and CR 18. She submitted a motion for same, Jim Young seconded it, and the Council unanimously passed the motion. Ms. Bohl will make copies of the resolutions, in the proper format, for distribution at the Annual Congregation Meeting, Part 2, in January 2016.

- In opening devotions, Pastor Scott posed the question to Council members: How do you make another person's life better? He noted several aspects of the other person's life-physically, emotionally, spiritually, and socially. In living our mission as the people of God, individually and as a church, it's our challenge and our responsibility.
- 2. Pastor Scott emphasized that Adult Bible Study is underway. The group is now studying Luke, then will study Jeremiah, and so on, concluding with Revelation.
- 3. Pastor Scott, President Larry Rice, Secretary Marilyn Bohl, and Business Manager Hermine Burg had just met with Andreas Hirsch of the Southwest California Synod office relative to our position descriptions and office work, and the services the Synod is offering.
- 4. Finance Committee Co-Chair Marilyn Bohl pointed out that Year to date (YTD) total budget receipts were \$194,827.85 and YTD total budget expenses were \$195,981.22.
 She concluded that Trinity's 2015 actual budget expenses were about \$1100 more than 2015 budget receipts received.
- 5. Ms. Bohl stated that members contributed \$625.00 toward the cantata guest singers from CSULB, so only \$275.00 of the up to \$2,000.00 authorized by Council previously was actually transferred from the McKenzie Mortuary line item to the Trinity Concert Series line item to pay for them. The free will offering from the evening of \$413.00 (together with the \$625.00 above)

was credited to the Trinity Concert Series line item, \$900 was paid to the four CSULB vocalists, and only \$20.78 was submitted as reception expenses. Thanks to all who contributed.

- 6. Oil revenue is way down this year-only \$10, 596.03, compared to \$35,451.24 in 2014. President Rice has been asked by the Executive Committee to investigate CA Resources [the firm from which we now receive our oil checks] by contacting people on the City of Long Beach staff who may be knowledgeable of the firm. He has contacted Sharon Wiseman, the Mayor's Assistant. She is looking into the firm for him.
- 7. A motion was passed unanimously to establish the two previously approved procedure documents of collecting rents and donations and of paying bills and invoices as Continuing Resolution (CR) 17 and Continuing Resolution (CR) 18.
- 8. A motion passed unanimously directing the financial officers to treat \$19,800, or 30% of Pastor Scott's salary, as Pastor's housing allowance as he has requested.
- The Council elected 2016 Council officers as follows: President – Larry Rice, Vice President – Trevor Wolter, Secretary – Marilyn Bohl, Treasurer – Jan Laser, Financial Secretary – Marilyn Bohl.
- 10. The Council appointed Hermine Burg to the position of Business Manager, with the understanding that actions to redefine the role are in process.
